Texas Proud Festival May 29 and 30. This year, it's all happening on the south side of the river, with a focus on the courthouse square and the Red Top. A chili cookoff will occur at Grenwelge park. The Brazos Bottom Cow'ographers will set up their town on the river by the jail. Check out their schedule below. Adopt-A-Pier Campaign. Through hard work from volunteers running LanTex Theater shows, the garage sale, the quilt raffle and lots of jail tours and T-shirt sales, in addition to individual donors (the Zochs, McPhersons, Mike Heaston and "Pier Support" groups), we now have ¼ of the piers financed. Another 8 piers and we have matched the upcoming THC grant! *Get on board and donate \$1200 for a pier.* It's tax deductible and you'll be acknowledged on a permanent plaque.

Strategic Planning for the Friends. The Board of Directors, Sarah Franklin and Mike Reagor met with the LCRA for a free strategic planning session. Over yummy Cooper's BarBQ and drinks, we came up with a new mission statement, went over our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT), and set some goals for a 5 year plan. Sarah Page and Alysia Cook from the LCRA pretty much reached to the back depths of our brains to pull out information and ideas for our restoration efforts and dreams for the future of the jail. They will produce a report in the next few weeks that will summarize their assessment and our goals. It was an exhausting experience, but very useful for our future success in fundraising, marketing, etc.

As you may know, we will need approximately \$2 million to restore the jail to its 1895 glory and turn it into a major tourist attraction. We plan to do this in phases, outlined by our architectural master plan. However, we will need help in fundraising and marketing, as well as a lot of other things. Next month, we will begin interviewing professional fundraising consultants to help us learn how to go about this. Of course, I will continue to peck away at grants, but we need some contributors and commitments from more sponsors. I will be forming a fundraising committee soon to do this. Think about it and call me if you are interested. This could be one of the greatest, most satisfying things that you do. I've always said, "You don't ask, you don't get!" It's also been said that, "it doesn't hurt to ask." Either way, we need to ask!

Our New Mission Statement: *The mission of the Friends of the Llano Red Top Jail is to restore, preserve and promote the jail and its historical significance.*
